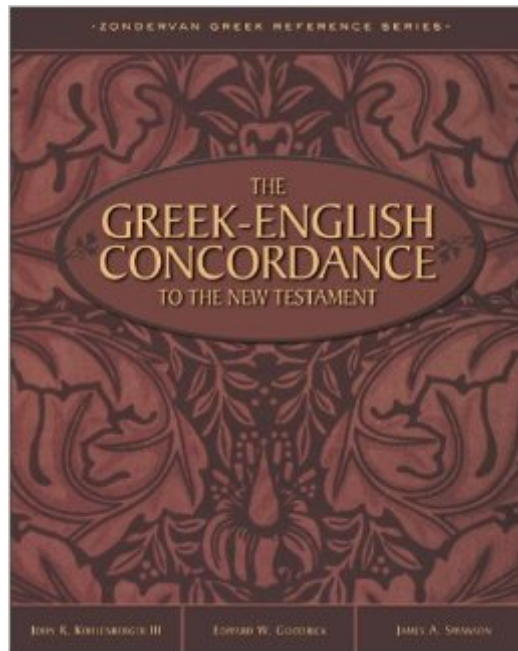

The Greek-English Concordance to the New Testament is an exhaustive index to three Greek texts: UBS4, Nestle-Aland 26, and the Greek text underlying the New International Version of the Bible. It replaces the venerable Englishman's Greek Concordance by George Wigram, published over 150 years ago. FEATURES: * Lists all occurrences of a given Greek word (even where there is not a direct English equivalent) in Greek alphabetical order * Shows the interrelationship between the English and Greek texts, including redundant cognates and repeated Greek words, as well as multiple-word translations * Uses the Goodrick-Kohlenberger numbering system (with cross-reference to Strong's numbers), allowing for accurate identification of Greek words and use with The Zondervan NIV Exhaustive Concordance * Keyed to the Bauer-Arndt-Gingrich-Danker Greek Lexicon (BAGD) and The New International Dictionary of New Testament Theology (NIDNTT) * Exhaustive NIV-to-Greek index * Includes a phrase concordance for phrases such as Son of Man, kingdom of God, etc.

This is not a review as such but a summary and a warning. This concordance lists the greek words in (greek) alphabetical order but the scripture contexts etc. are all in English, not in Greek. If your Greek is poor, this book will be helpful to you. If you already have at least 1st year Greek (i.e. if you've gone through Mounce's Basics of Biblical Greek or something similar), Then you will probably find this book too basic. I ordered it and only on examination did I find that I should have

ordered instead the companion volume to this, The Exhaustive Concordance to the Greek New Testament also by Kohlenberger. The Exhaustive Concordance lists the words and the contexts in Greek (and is 4 or 5 dollars cheaper!).

This volume of concordance to New Testament Greek is a must for every reader of the Bible who wants to get an easy and fast access to where words are found in the New Testament. The advantage of this concordance over a Greek to Greek concordance is obviously that in this Greek-English concordance the key words are listed in Greek characters, with a direct transcription to English and the meaning of the word. In addition the excerpts from the Scriptures are rendered in English with the key word in the text highlighted, so it is in fact very easy to use, also for the student who is not very much accustomed to Greek. Along with a Greek-English dictionary you practically don't need any other aids for delving into New Testament Greek.

This is an indispensable resource for pastors and students of the Bible, but it does require a basic knowledge of the Greek language. It lists each word in Greek and then shows every verse where the word is used. The verses where each Greek word is found are shown in English (NIV), which is helpful. It also shows the different ways the word is translated in the English Bible, which is also very helpful. This is immensely beneficial for doing word studies. You're able to see every place where the same Greek word is used, and how it is used by the Biblical authors. For those of us who are devoted to exegesis and expository preaching, this resource is priceless. For those who do not have a working knowledge of Greek, it is recommended to purchase the NIV Exhaustive Concordance to look up each word by its numbering system. If not, then this book will be challenging to use. It comes with a concise Greek dictionary in the back of the book. But once again, the words are in Greek and the definition is in English. If you've taken Beginning Greek Grammar in college or seminary (at least the first class), then you will be fine. I've been preaching for 20 years and I can't live without this exegetical tool. I highly recommend it!

A concordance is an indispensable tool for any student of the Bible. This volume is an incredibly helpful resource for study especially in relation to preaching, and teaching. However, if one did not know Greek, or at least the alphabet and the word he or she was looking for it would be too difficult and time consuming to really be helpful. Money would be better spent on an NIV exhaustive concordance, or even buying both the NIV concordance from Zondervan, as well as this one. The G/K numbers correspond. Of all word study tools the concordance is most basic and necessary.

This one is put together nicely and is easy to use even with only a basic understanding of Greek.

If you want to better understand the words used in the original Greek of the New Testament, this will be a big help. Even better would be to use this reference after you have worked through "Greek for The Rest of Us" by William Mounce. [Greek for the Rest of Us](#)
