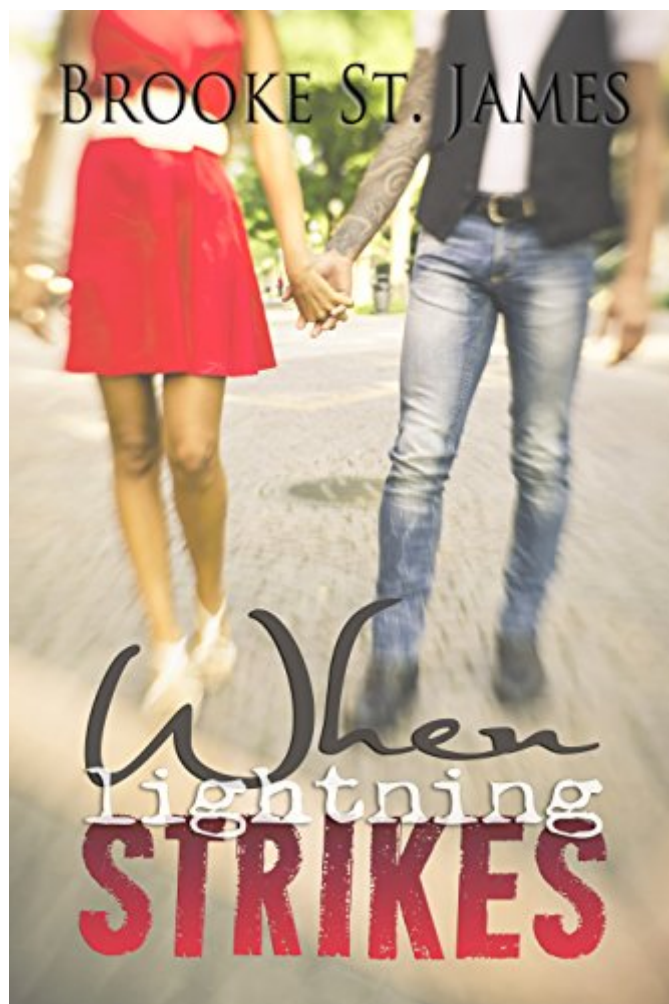

"When Lightning Strikes" is a well-paced romance novel that is fun but unforgettable. Having read

another Brooke St. James novel, I was curious (and excited) to see what this one would hold.
